# Annual Teacher Training Scheduled for June 23

Teachers who will be implementing Tales of the Towpath for the first time during the 2011-2012 school year, or current teachers who want a refresher course, are invited to the Delaware & Lehigh National Heritage Corridor's annual teacher training day at Hugh Moore Park in Easton on June 23. We highly recommend this training.

The D&L will be teaming with the National Canal Museum on a full day of curriculum instruction and activities that will introduce teachers to canal life in the 1800s. We'll have a blacksmith on hand, you'll learn how to scrub clothing on a washboard, and you'll design your own canal boat and see how much weight it can carry before it sinks. You'll also take a canal boat ride on the Lehigh Canal with Hank and George, the park's loveable mules, providing the power.

Classroom sessions will introduce you to the curriculum and the history that shaped it. You'll also learn how to use the Tales of the Towpath website and you'll listen to implementation strategies from teachers who have used the curriculum the past two years. The D&L will provide pastry and beverages for breakfast and a hearty lunch.

Psst! Did you hear Facebook Finn will be debuting soon? program in the classroom. We are proud to say that all the lessons are volunteer driven.


