Bring History to Life at the National Canal Museum

EASTON (February 1, 2016) – The National Canal Museum, an affiliate of the Delaware & Lehigh National Heritage Corridor is in need of docents for its annual Immersion Days field trips at Hugh Moore Park in Easton.

Immersion Days is the Canal Museum's signature field trip program for elementary-age students. Docents will use historical context to teach lessons on the life of kids in canal families, and the scientific and technological concepts important to the construction of the Lehigh and Delaware canals.

Field trips all take place for six weeks, Monday through Friday, from April 25 through June 3 in Easton. Docents work approximately five hours a day and receive \$10 per hour. Docents are not required to work for all six weeks, but priority will be given to applicants who can work the majority of the field trip schedule.
