**Mobile Workshop 1 – D&L Trail Corridor –** explore the newly constructed and opened sections of the D&L Trail within Northampton and Lehigh Counties. Participants will walk approximately 1 mile in Northampton and North Catasauqua boroughs along the Lehigh River, pass active construction in Catasauqua and Hanover Township and see how these historic Boroughs are revitalizing their downtowns around the D&L Trail and September 11<sup>th</sup> National Memorial Trail corridors.
