THE LINK Trail Network is Announced

Delaware & Lehigh National Heritage Corridor and partners announce new trail network in Lehigh Valley

Easton, PA — The Delaware & Lehigh National Heritage Corridor, a diverse, multi-faceted organization, supporting 165 miles of trail in eastern Pennsylvania, has partnered with the Pennsylvania Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, Lehigh Valley Greenways, Lehigh Valley Planning Commission, Discover Lehigh Valley, Wildlands Conservancy, Pennsylvania Department of Transportation, and Northampton and Lehigh Counties in order to form THE LINK Trail Network.

THE LINK Trail Network will be an interconnected network of safe, beautiful multi-use trails offering Lehigh Valley residents and visitors the opportunity for year-round outdoor recreation, alternative transportation, and healthy living. THE LINK offers over 125 miles of trails with plans for 100 additional miles and to close priority trail gaps in the near future.

Advancement of THE LINK Trail Network will increase quality of life, generate economic growth, protect the environment, and improve population health as the region continues to change in the coming years. In turn, the D&L and partners are optimistic about the local community, health and business sector support of this initiative.

The official unveiling of THE LINK took place Thursday, November 1st, 3:30 p.m. at Northampton Canal Street Park (14th and Canal Streets).
