


**DELAWARE & LEHIGH

Part of the Anthracite Region, **Carbon County** is the first county to be fully connected by the D&L Trail. The county is juxtaposed with mountains, pastures, and rapids with railroad, canal, and vibrant towns – all awaiting exploration. Carbon County was home to many industrial firsts and businesses; including the first successful mining and shipping of anthracite and the first permanent and commercially successful railroad. Today, the county has become a tourist destination for visitors interested in history and outdoor recreation opportunities.

FEATURED SITE: JIM THORPE

Established in 1818 as Mauch Chunk, the town was later named Jim Thorpe after the legendary Native American athlete. Its steep hillsides, narrow streets, and terraced gardens earned the town its nickname “The Switzerland of America.” The beauty of this region has beckoned people for almost two centuries. Here, entrepreneurs like Josiah White and Asa Packer formed industries that shipped countless tons of anthracite coal and other goods to market via canals and railroads. Today visitors explore the river, shops, and trails all in one spot.
