FEATURED SITE: NATIONAL CANAL MUSEUM

Located along the Lehigh Canal in Easton's Hugh Moore Park, the museum serves as a destination to learn about life on the canal. Through its hands-on exhibits and a mule-drawn canal boat ride the museum is devoted to preserving and sharing the history of canals. In 2017, the D&L formally acquired the museum recognizing the opportunity to further their mission to connect people to the enduring industrial heritage of the Corridor. Together, the D&L and National Canal Museum are uniquely positioned to interpret and exhibit this industrial heritage.
